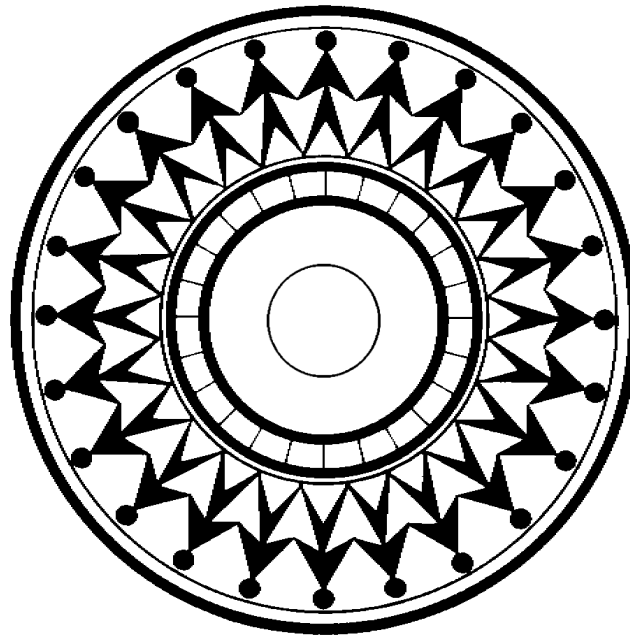

ABSTRACT

A Comparative Study of the Use and Effectiveness of Different Risk Assessment Models in CPS Decision Making Processes was a three-year project conducted by the Children's Research Center and funded by the National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect. The central objective of this study was to determine the relative validity and reliability of three different risk assessment systems used in Child Protective Services (CPS). In addition to comparing system validity and reliability, this research was intended to: 1) identify correlates of child maltreatment in each jurisdiction studied; 2) determine the degree to which risk assessment models are transferable among jurisdictions; 3) determine the extent to which site-specific risk assessment systems might offer improvements over existing systems; 4) determine the degree to which worker characteristics are related to case outcomes; 5) determine if services have a significant effect on outcomes; and 6) determine which risk factors are valid across all sites, and which have little or no relationship to outcomes.

The three risk assessment instruments used in this study included the Washington Risk Assessment Matrix, the California Family Assessment Factor Analysis, and the Michigan Structured Decision Making System's Family Risk Assessment of Abuse and Neglect. Both the Washington and the California models are consensus-based assessment systems, while the Michigan model is an actuarial instrument developed from empirical studies of child maltreatment.

Data were collected from four project jurisdictions: Alameda county, California; Dade county, Florida; Jackson county, Missouri; and Macomb, Muskegon, Ottawa, and Wayne counties in Michigan. Due to complexities in gathering the data, the vast majority of cases in this study came from urban settings. In total, 1,400 families constituted the validity study sample. All were investigated in the fall of 1995 or early 1996. The number of cases for which each risk assessment was actually completed, however, ranged from 1,335 to 1,396 (Baird and Wagner, 2000). Outcome information was collected over an 18-month follow-up period, including rates of subsequent investigations, substantiations, and placements in out-of-home care. The sample for the reliability component of the research consists of 20 cases per site – ten substantiated and ten unsubstantiated cases (except in the case of Michigan where 20 substantiated cases were chosen for reliability testing) – for a grand total of 80 reliability study sample cases.

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OVERVIEW

Background

The dramatic rise in the number of child maltreatment allegations over the past two decades has highlighted the need for greater efficiency, consistency, and validity in Child Protective Services (CPS) decision-making. To increase the consistency and validity of decision-making, many agencies have turned to a variety of assessment systems. Most of these systems estimate the risk that a child will be abused or neglected in the future and thus fall under the general rubric of “risk assessment.” Risk assessment systems used in CPS are formalized methods that provide structure and criteria with the expectation that structure will increase the reliability and accuracy of CPS worker decision-making, helping workers to provide services to families more effectively and better protect children. A variety of systems for estimating risk have been developed over the years.

Consensus-Based Systems

In these systems, workers assess specific client characteristics identified by the consensus judgment of experts and then exercise their own clinical judgment about the risk of future abuse or neglect. Although the volume of research on these systems is considerable, these systems have rarely undergone rigorous evaluations. Critics of the consensus-based approach argue that such systems lack predictive utility because clinical judges differentially select and weight information about the subject.

Actuarial Systems

These systems are based on empirical study of CPS cases and future abuse/neglect outcomes. Under this approach, research identifies items/factors with strong associations with future abuse and neglect and informs the construction of actuarial instruments which workers score to identify low, medium, or high risk families. Actuarial assessment methods, which require extensive longitudinal research, have only recently been introduced in CPS. A large body of research evidence in experimental psychology and corrections supports the view that actuarial instruments estimate future behavior more accurately than can an individual decision-maker unaided by actuarial information (even decision-makers who have had extensive clinical training).

This study, funded by the National Center on Child Abuse and Neglect, directly compared the validity and reliability of risk designations using two consensus-based instruments and one actuarial instrument. These comparisons were undertaken in two separate analytical endeavors. The validity investigation constituted the primary focus of the research activity and provided the overall sample, while the reliability research component used a subset of those original cases.

Rationale

The Definition and Measurement of Validity

The validity of decision systems has traditionally been measured by the degree to which predictions about case outcomes are realized. Such predictions rely upon calculations of false positives, false negatives, and the overall percentage of correct predictions. These methods may not be suitable, however, for gauging the efficacy of a risk assessment system when the probability of success/failure is substantially different from 50-50. When events are relatively rare, they are inherently difficult to predict. In such instances, simply assuming that an event will not occur may produce more predictive accuracy than any attempt to determine where or when an occurrence is likely. For example, if subsequent maltreatment (failure) is reported in only 15% of cases opened to CPS, then simply predicting that no opened case will have subsequent maltreatment reported produces an 85% “hit rate.” Obviously, such a prediction, while highly accurate, is of little value to a CPS agency.

Other fields, such as juvenile justice, medicine, and adult corrections have largely abandoned the idea that risk assessment is an exercise in prediction. Instead, terms such as base expectancy rates have replaced discussions of false positives and false negatives. Conceptually, the use of false positives and false negatives to evaluate risk assessment systems creates another dilemma. While outcomes are often dichotomous, most risk assessment systems assign cases to three or more risk levels. One of the systems evaluated in this study (the Washington system) uses six levels of risk. If system efficacy is based on outcome prediction, it must be asked what prediction is being made for cases at intermediate risk levels. Knowing the answer allows workers to establish appropriate service plans, just as similar information allows doctors and patients to decide on a particular course of action.

Therefore, in evaluating the relative efficacy of the California, Michigan, and Washington risk assessment systems, clarity concerning expectations is critical. The terms, “prediction” and “classification,” are often used interchangeably, yet really connote different expectations. Prediction is more precise than classification, and refers to the expectation of a particular outcome on the basis of observation, experience, or scientific reason. Classification, on the other hand, refers to the systematic arrangement of cases into groups or categories according to established criteria. While accurate prediction would greatly benefit child protective services and society, it has not proven feasible. For the present research, the goals of risk assessment are more modest. For the validity research component, the goal is to assign cases to different categories based on observed rates of behavior.

Risk scales, in general, explain little of the variance in outcomes – 8% to 15% is common. The low level of explained variance occurs in nearly every field ranging from automobile insurance to criminal justice to child protective services. This fact leads some researchers to caution against the use of risk assessment, claiming these instruments are not valid because they fail to predict accurately who will succeed and who will fail. But if, as noted above, simple classification is the goal, explained variance in outcomes is of little consequence. What is important is the degree to which families in different risk groups perform differently. Furthermore, if prediction is not the

goal, then the issue of false positives and false negatives is moot. Classification recognizes that a high risk designation is not a prediction of failure. A high risk designation is, instead, a clear indication that such families may require more attention and more services, because cases in this designation tend to “fail” at higher rates than do cases in other risk groups. The greater the differences found among groups, the better the instrument. In essence, the validity of risk assessment systems is measured by the degree to which subgroups of meaningful size are identified by each system and the degree to which different rates of subsequent maltreatment are reported for each subgroup.

The Definition and Measurement of Reliability

Reliability or consistency is the degree to which a risk assessment will produce the same answer if applied by different workers to the same case, or to the same case by the same worker over time (Johnson, 1992). Reliability is obviously critical to decision efficacy: if two different decision makers make different decisions regarding a case, at most one of them can be correct (Ruscio, 1998). CPS agencies have engaged in a variety of approaches to improve consistency of risk assessment decisions including intensive staff training programs, case staffings, teaming concepts, and most importantly, the use of structured guidelines for assessing cases that bring a number of different perspectives into the decision making process.

Determining the level of reliability attained by risk assessment systems presents a variety of problems. In actual practice, assessments of families are generally dependent upon a variety of formal and informal activities and observations that include record reviews, personal contacts with the client, collateral contacts with law enforcement, school, medical and other social service personnel, and in many instances, consultations with colleagues and supervisors. Actual practice, therefore, is nearly impossible to replicate in a test situation.

To measure the reliability of a risk assessment system (and decision making in general), two possibilities emerge: 1) reading social histories and all other documentation contained in case files and using these data to complete risk assessment forms; and 2) creating case vignettes to serve as the basis for risk ratings. In both instances, a number of readers assess the same material and their ratings are then compared to determine the extent to which they agree or disagree on the level of risk each case represents.

Each approach to measuring reliability has its own strengths and weaknesses. Developing case vignettes gives the researchers greater control over the data provided to readers, helping to ensure that information needed to rate a case is adequate to the task, but it can also introduce an artificial dimension to the research. Vignettes often are based on actual cases, but enhanced to provide enough data to answer all or most questions contained in the risk assessment. In most vignettes, information is presented in a rather complete and orderly fashion. This does not necessarily represent how information is obtained and recorded in an actual field investigation and the test, therefore, deviates to some degree from actual practice.

Reading case files presents the opposite problem. Although more representative of actual case practice, case files may not contain all the data necessary to adequately assess cases. Both the

quality and quantity of information will vary depending on the skills of the worker involved, the agency's policies regarding case recording, and the degree to which workers adhere to these policies. Neither approach will produce all of the data available to an actual decision maker. Information gained through personal contact and observation cannot be fully replicated, even when a caseworker's observations are discussed in the official record. There is, however, no evidence that introducing these data to the assessment process would increase reliability. In fact, information theory strongly suggests that having more factors to consider, especially those resulting from subjective interpretation of client attitudes and personal characteristics, actually reduces interrater reliability (Clear, 1988).

Due to the limitations of prior studies, little is known about the reliability of various risk assessment systems used by CPS. A recent study of case decision making, however, presents an excellent model for assessing reliability. The Chapin Hall study (Rossi et al., 1996), combines an adequate number of study cases (70) with an appropriate measure of interrater reliability – percent agreement subsequently adjusted for “chance” using Cohen's Kappa. This approach is simple and straightforward, and measures precisely what needs to be measured in the present research, i.e., the degree to which individual raters arrive at the same estimate of risk. Using this approach facilitates comparison of the reliability of different risk assessment systems.

Instruments Tested

Risk assessment models that typify both actuarial and consensus-based systems used in various jurisdictions nationwide were selected for this study. Two of the more widely used versions of consensus-based systems are the Washington Risk Assessment Matrix, a risk assessment system developed by practitioners in the State of Washington, and the California Family Assessment Factor Analysis. Because it is the most widely used actuarial-based approach, the Michigan Structured Decision Making (SDM) System's Family Risk Assessment of Abuse and Neglect was selected for this study.

Washington Risk Assessment Matrix

According to the Washington Department of Social and Health Services “Risk Factor Matrix Guide,” the consensus-based Washington Risk Assessment Matrix identifies and organizes information needed to predict the risk of abuse/neglect. Overall risk is defined as “an assertion of the likelihood of child abuse/neglect absent successful intervention.” The Washington Risk Assessment Matrix includes six overall risk categories that are defined by “the severity of child abuse and neglect which is likely to occur rather than by the probability of child abuse/neglect, no matter how severe or minor. In other words, the overall risk level assumes that child abuse/neglect will occur and only asserts how severe the child abuse/neglect will be when it occurs.”

California Family Assessment Factor Analysis

The second risk assessment model, the California Family Assessment Factor Analysis, is an adaptation of the State of Illinois Factor Worksheet and represents another consensus-based

approach to risk assessment. The California Risk Assessment Curriculum for Child Welfare Services “Child Welfare Training” manual subscribes to the following risk definition (p. 1):

Risk assessment is a process used to assess the level of risk to a child who is reported for alleged abuse and/or neglect...It is also a tool which measures and organizes factors present in abuse and neglect situations, and which are considered as important in describing the current safety and in predicting the future safety of the child.

This definition of risk differs from that used by the Washington model in that the Washington approach assumes that there will be subsequent abuse or neglect and the final risk classification predicts the degree of subsequent abuse and/or neglect whereas the overall risk classifications reached by the California model are based on the likelihood of future maltreatment. Both systems recognize, however, that no one approach is designed to replace worker judgment.

Michigan Family Risk Assessment of Abuse and Neglect

The third risk assessment system included in this study is the Michigan Family Risk Assessment of Abuse and Neglect, which is based on the statistical relationship between behavior and characteristics and subsequent abuse and/or neglect. The Michigan model is designed to classify families into four different risk categories based on the likelihood of abuse or neglect in the future. It does not predict future behavior; rather, it is meant to assign cases to different categories based on observed rates of behavior. Like the two consensus-based models, the Michigan risk assessment system recognizes that no system can substitute entirely for the judgment or skill of CPS workers. It can, however, help practitioners to focus their assessment on the relatively small set of case characteristics that have demonstrated a strong statistical relationship to future child maltreatment.

Design

Site Selection

For both the validity and reliability portions of the study, data were collected from four project jurisdictions: Alameda county, California; Dade county, Florida; Jackson county, Missouri; and Macomb, Muskegon, Ottawa, and Wayne counties in Michigan. The original sample methodology for the overall study called for including only cases with an investigation completion date on or after November 15, 1995. From this list of agency-generated cases, readers were to select every substantiated incident of abuse/neglect and every fourth case of unsubstantiated abuse/neglect as identified by the investigation disposition until data were collected for 300 substantiated cases at each site and roughly 130 unsubstantiated cases, for a total of approximately 1,200 substantiated and 400 unsubstantiated cases for inclusion in the overall study. The lone exception to this sampling methodology was in the Michigan counties as files were available only for cases with substantiated incidents of maltreatment; therefore, Michigan sample cases do not include any unsubstantiated cases.

Case Reader Characteristics and Training

Case reading teams consisting of three people per jurisdiction were selected and trained. Case readers were primarily female. Five were African American while the remaining were White. Readers had an average of nearly ten years experience in social services, and all but two had at least a Bachelor's degree. None of the readers had previously utilized any of the risk assessment models. One member of each team was trained thoroughly by an expert to complete one risk assessment model. Readers for each risk assessment model received a three-day intensive training session, including inter-rater reliability testing, along with a cultural sensitivity and awareness training to help them recognize and eliminate personal bias based on race or ethnicity from their work.

Instruments

The Washington Risk Assessment Matrix groups risk factors by child characteristics (five items), severity of child abuse/neglect (nine items), chronicity or recurrent episodes of child abuse/neglect (one item), caretaker characteristics for primary and secondary caretakers (11 items each), caretaker-child relationship (six items each), social economic factors (four items), and perpetrator access (one item). These risk factors are rated from 0 to 5 (0 for no risk, 1 for low, 2 for moderately low, 3 for moderate, 4 for moderately high, and 5 for high risk). The rating system also includes narrative on child, family, and community strengths and resources and a summary assessment using the risk factors identified above. Workers use the highest risk element in the severity and chronicity groups to establish a risk assessment baseline and then use the other categories of the matrix to balance these factors against family strengths. If the risk factors outweigh the family strengths, the worker assigns a final risk classification no lower than the baseline risk indicated by the severity and chronicity groups. If the family strengths outweigh the risk factors, the risk indicated by the severity and chronicity groups become the upper limit for final risk classification. The Washington guide further encourages experienced staff to “identify constellations of factors which commonly occur in physical abuse/physical neglect/sexual abuse and give these patterns special weight because these factors are mutually reinforcing.” Stated another way, this system is not designed to replace worker experience, but to aid their understanding of child abuse and neglect in arriving at an overall level of risk. The worker then assigns a final risk rating which can be no, low, moderately low, moderate, moderately high, or high risk. This tool is used by CPS intake, the investigating worker, and child welfare services workers to assist in case planning. A copy can be found in Appendix D.

The California risk assessment system recognizes five types of factors: precipitating incident (four items), child assessment (five items), caretaker assessment (seven items), family assessment factors/stressors (five items), and family/agency interaction (two items). Each child in the family is rated for each factor into one of five categories: not applicable, insufficient information, low risk, moderate risk, or high risk. These individual assessments are then summarized to reflect the highest risk code for each factor. In addition, each type of factor includes narrative observations. Also included in this risk assessment model is a family assessment narrative of strengths, problems, and any additional information deemed appropriate by the caseworker. Based on all of the above, the case is rated as low, moderate, or high risk.

California workers are trained to use this risk tool from the initial report throughout case assessment and planning, service provision, and case termination. A copy can be found in Appendix C.

The Michigan system consists of three parts. The first two parts are the Neglect Risk Assessment (11 items) and the Abuse Risk Assessment (12 items). The third part is a separate Family Strengths and Needs Assessment comprised of 13 items. Caseworkers score each item on the Neglect and Abuse scales, total the results, and rate the family into a low, moderate, high, or intensive risk classification. This classification is then used to establish intervention requirements. The Michigan strengths and needs assessment is used in case planning, assisting workers in establishing priorities, and referring cases to needed services. For purposes of this study, the point values were removed from the risk form and the case readers collected raw data without reaching a risk classification. By remaining “blind” to the final risk classification, readers only collected data on cases and did not conduct a formal risk assessment; this approach eliminated the potential for personal bias to affect classifications and consequently, the reliability of the system. A copy of the Michigan risk model can be found in Appendix B.

For data collection purposes, information concerning child and family characteristics, the nature of the abuse/neglect allegation(s) and substantiation(s) (if any), and the investigation outcome was summarized using a Case Survey Document. Case Survey Documents were created for each site and tailored to reflect site-specific terminology, particularly in the way sites recorded type of abuse and neglect. The Case Survey Documents can be found in Appendix E.

Another instrument used in this research is the Prior and Subsequent History Survey, which summarizes CPS investigations that occurred before and after the sampled investigation, and the service referral and utilization history of the family before and after the sampled investigation. A copy of the Prior and Subsequent History Survey used at site can be found in Appendix A.

The final instrument consists of the Case Worker Survey, which summarizes demographic information relating to the case worker responsible for investigating the sampled CPS event. Information recorded includes sex, age, education, years of CPS experience, and tenure with agency. A copy of the Case Worker Survey can be found in Appendix F.

Validity Research Component

The original research design called for a sample of 1600 cases. Unfortunately, time and resource constraints forced investigators to reduce the final sample to 1,400 cases. All cases were investigated in the fall of 1995 or early 1996. Risk assessments were not completed on all 1,400 families because of problems with lack of data and periodic absences of particular case readers. The number of cases for which each risk assessment was actually completed, however, ranged from 1,335 to 1,396 (Baird and Wagner, 2000). The number of cases available to analyze each system is presented below:

Michigan: 1,396 (99.7% of total sample)
Washington: 1,367 (97.6% of total sample)
California: 1,335 (95.4% of total sample)

Sample Characteristics

Among cases comprising the sample for the validity research, 94.5% of the primary caretakers were the victim's birth parent and nearly 90% were female. The mean age of the primary caretakers was 32.9 years. In 47.9% of homes assessed there was a single caretaker. In 25.9% of all families, there was only one child present in the home at the time of investigation. Nearly 32% had two children, 21.2% had three, and 21.1% had four or more. A large proportion of the sample was on some form of assistance; 44.4% received AFDC payments, and 35.3% were receiving food stamps at the time of the index investigation.

Selection and Definition of Outcomes

The primary measure of validity used in this study was the ability of each system to classify cases into risk groups with significantly different rates of subsequent maltreatment reported. Outcome measures included:

- Subsequent investigations of abuse/neglect within 18 months of the investigation that brought each case into the study cohort;
- Substantiation resulting from these investigations over the 18-month follow-up period; and
- Placements in out-of-home care over the same 18-month follow-up period.

The study design originally included child injury as an outcome measure, but problems were encountered in collecting these data. In addition to a very low base rate, the manner in which child injuries were cited in case files varied substantially among agencies and among workers within the agencies participating in the study. After careful review, it was determined that the reliability of these data was insufficient for inclusion as an outcome measure.

Analytic Considerations

With different numbers of cases available for each risk instrument, the original investigators considered two options for comparing the validity of the three risk assessment systems. The first option was to use only cases for which all three instruments were completed. The second option was to use all available cases for each system and to report results noting that a few cases in each analysis are not represented in the other samples. The investigators conducted preliminary analyses under both options and found only minute and insignificant differences in the classification breakdown for each system under the two scenarios. In order to maximize sample size, the investigators subsequently decided to compare results using all cases completed with a particular assessment.

Some cases, however, were excluded from the analysis. In instances in which a child was removed from the home and remained in placement at the close of the investigation, the family was not included in the validity study because placement may have greatly reduced or even completely eliminated any potential for future maltreatment. In total, 188 families were removed from analysis of the California system, 193 from the Washington analysis, and 194 from the analysis of the Michigan system.

One other serious problem was noted with data collected during the follow-up period. In Alameda county, despite a concerted effort, including a search of an automated state database to locate all files, outcomes for 60 families in the Alameda sample could not be retrieved. The low rates of outcomes reported for the remaining Alameda county cases, compared to results from other study sites as well as other California counties indicated that cases may not be missing on a random basis. Both the rates of new investigation and new substantiation found in Alameda county were well below those reported by other jurisdictions in either this study and/or in the separate CRC study conducted in five other metropolitan California counties. While excluding Alameda cases from the validation study does little to alter the overall results (all patterns noted remain in place with Alameda data included) it was felt that both the number of cases with missing outcomes (60) and the doubts that cases were missing on a random basis, supported the exclusion of Alameda county data when the three systems are directly compared.

When Alameda county cases and cases where the child(ren) remained in out-of-home placement were deleted from the primary analysis, the total samples remaining for each assessment system were:

California:	876 families
Michigan:	929 families
Washington:	908 families

Reliability Research Component

The original sample methodology for the overall study called for including only cases with an investigation completion date on or after November 15, 1995. Using the sample of 1400 cases from the validity study, the first three substantiated cases of physical abuse, two cases of substantiated sexual abuse, and three substantiated neglect cases were selected from each site for inclusion in the reliability study. Once these cases had been selected, the next two substantiated and unsubstantiated cases reaching an investigative conclusion were selected in order of completion date at each site, regardless of maltreatment type alleged, bringing the reliability study sample to 20 cases per site – ten substantiated and ten unsubstantiated cases (except in the case of Michigan where 20 substantiated cases were chosen for reliability testing) – for a grand total of 80 reliability study sample cases.

Once the reliability case samples were identified, copies of the case files were stripped of identifying information and sent to the case reading teams at the other three sites. Each team member read each case and completed his or her respective risk assessment instrument, producing four independent ratings for each of the 80 reliability study cases.

Reliability Measures

The original investigators used two measures of interrater reliability in this analysis. The first was percent agreement among all raters. In other words, did readers reach the same conclusion for the same cases, i.e. agree on final risk classification? This method of reliability was selected because it is a straightforward and easily quantifiable measure. In this study, the highest degree of overall interrater reliability when measured by percent agreement would be reached in instances in which all four readers reach the same conclusion. However, because reaching 100% agreement based on information contained in case files may be too high an expectation, 75% agreement was set as an acceptable level of interrater reliability. The 75% agreement is achieved when three out of four raters independently arrive at the same conclusion.

The second reliability measure selected by the investigators was Cohen's Kappa. The Cohen's Kappa is simply a measure of agreement between each pair of raters adjusted for chance. For example, when risk ratings are limited to three choices, even random assignment to risk levels should result in agreement one of every three times. A zero kappa is achieved when actual agreement equals that expected by chance. A positive kappa represents the level of agreement obtained beyond chance.

Each risk assessment system categorizes cases into an overall risk level. However, the number of risk categories varies among these systems as follows:

California	Michigan	Washington
Low	Low	No Risk Low Risk
Moderate	Moderate	Moderately Low Risk Moderate Risk
High	High Very High	Moderately High Risk High Risk

Because fewer risk levels are designated in the California system it could be expected that, everything else being equal, its reliability would be the highest. Therefore, it was necessary to combine risk levels designated by the Michigan and Washington systems before comparing results. Therefore, Michigan's high and very high risk levels were combined under the designation "high risk." Washington's six levels were combined as follows:

No Risk and Low Risk	=	Low
Moderately Low and Moderate	=	Moderate
Moderately High and High	=	High

DESCRIPTION OF THE DATA FILE

NDACAN distributes these data as SAS transport or SPSS portable files. Other file formats and data subsets can be prepared by special request. Please contact NDACAN for more information.

File Characteristics

NDACAN distributes four data files for this project, VALIDITY, which has 1,400 cases and 1,031 variables, and WAREL, MIREL, and CAREL, which have 320 cases each. The file WAREL contains 66 variables, while MIREL contains 68 variables, and CAREL contains 163 variables. For all files, variables are listed in the order in which they appear on the risk assessment instrument. Variables that pertain only to particular sites are labeled as such, while variables without labels specifying a particular site contain information from all four sites.

Each case in the validity file, VALIDITY, corresponds to a family referred to child protective services and investigated in 1995 or 1996. The file contains variables from several different instruments used during the research. These instruments, arranged in order of appearance in the dataset, include the Prior and Subsequent History Survey, the Michigan Family Risk Assessment of Abuse/Neglect, the California Family Assessment Factor Analysis, the Washington Risk Factor Matrix, the Case Survey Document, and the Case Worker Survey. The range of variables contained in each instrument is explained below.

The three files, WAREL, MIREL, and CAREL, each contain information on the 80 investigations sampled for the reliability component of this research. Each investigation was read and scored by the four case readers trained in a particular risk assessment system. Therefore, each investigation is duplicated four times and is represented by four observations listed consecutively in the data file. Observations relating to the same investigation may be identified using the variable CRC#, which will contain identical values for a particular investigation. The files are named according to the risk assessment system studied: WAREL represents the Washington Risk Factor Matrix; MIREL represents the Michigan Family Risk Assessment of Abuse/Neglect; and CAREL represents the California Family Assessment Factor Analysis.

The three reliability research datasets also contain a few variables that do not appear in the VALIDITY dataset. In certain instances, information is contained in the reliability datasets and in the validity dataset but under different variable names. In other instances, the reliability

datasets contain completely unique variables that are not represented in the validity dataset. The table below summarizes these differences.

Washington Risk Factor Matrix (WAREL)

SITE	This variable is equivalent to the variable FSITE in the VALIDITY dataset.
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Michigan Family Risk Assessment of Abuse/Neglect (MIREL)

SITE	This variable is equivalent to the variable FSITE in the VALIDITY dataset.
NEGSCORE	This variable is equivalent to the variable NEGLVL in the VALIDITY dataset.
ABUSCORE	This variable is equivalent to the variable ABUSLVL in the VALIDITY dataset.
FSCORE	This variable is equivalent to the variable MRISKLVL in the VALIDITY dataset.
FSCORE3, NEGSCOR3, ABUSCOR3	These variables represent the 3 compressed levels of risk for overall risk, neglect, and abuse, respectively, as used in the original analysis. These variables do not have equivalent variables in the VALIDITY dataset.
NEGTOT, ABUSTOT	These variables are the total neglect and abuse scores obtained after totaling the individual item scores. These variables do not have equivalent variables in the VALIDITY dataset.

California Family Assessment Factor Analysis (CAREL)

SITE	This variable is equivalent to the variable FSITE in the VALIDITY dataset.
RISKRATE	This variable is equivalent to the variable CRISKLVL in the VALIDITY dataset.

Several changes were made to the four datasets to help protect the anonymity of research participants. First, the NDACAN staff modified all date variables by setting all values representing the day to 1, but leaving the original month and year information intact. In addition, county-level information for the Michigan counties was suppressed because of concern that the

small numbers involved might permit identification of individuals. Thus, the secondary analyst can still identify cases provided from the Michigan project site, but cannot distinguish among cases originating in the four Michigan counties sampled.

The NDACAN staff urge the secondary user to inspect the data thoroughly before proceeding with analysis. The staff have made every attempt to clean the data contained in the four files, but have not eliminated all potentially invalid values or conflicting information. For example, among the variables derived from the California risk assessment system are variables containing birth years that would indicate the child was over 18 years of age at the time the household was investigated by child protective services. These variables appear in the files, VALIDITY and CAREL. Users should be aware of such values and must make their own decisions about how to deal with these data. In addition, the variable SWEDUC, representing case worker education in the file, VALIDITY, contains low values of 4 and 5. Again, users must decide how to handle these data.

Finally, original data elements that were contained in the data files provided by the investigators but that lacked adequate documentation were dropped from the final distributable version of the files. Examples of such deleted information include the family strengths, problems, and needs as originally recorded on the California Family Assessment Factor Analysis instrument.
